The official nomination do not means direct acceptance from us. The student needs to make an application - registration online.

The documents uploaded will be submitted to the Course Director and Institutional Coordinator for selection. An official acceptance letter will be issued and sent to the student and the Home University by e-mail if the student is approved. Only after that the student can be consider accepted to study with us.

The student needs to upload the following documents:

- Copy of the Identity Card or Passport;
- Learning Agreement Signed and stamped by the Home University and student;
- Transcript of Records issued, signed and stamped by the Home University;
- Curriculum Vitae and
- Portfolio (needs to be available online) Compulsory only for student's applying for the Courses of Cinema, Design and Architecture.

When the student arrives at Universidade Lusófona for the registration need to deliver to us:

- 1. English Language Certificate (B2) or Portuguese Language Certificate (B2) presenting International Certification TOEFL, ESOL, IELTS or OLS Exam;
- 2. Medical Report (our form be filled and stamped by the family's physician)
- 3. Copy of the health insurance from the Home University or private insurance and
- 4. Copy of your European Health Card.

All the documents requested are mandatory and part of the application process. Nevertheless, to avoid delays we asked them at the arrival at the University.

If we don't receive the requested documents we can consider not to accept/register the student. The student will return to the Home University and the mobility will not be valid.

The documents will be submitted to the Course Director and Institutional Coordinator for selection. An official acceptance letter will be issued and sent to the student and the Home University by e-mail if the student is approved. Only after that the student can be consider accepted to study with us.

A Transcript of Records will be issued as soon as all the student grades are available at the Student Page (NETPA) and after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI. [It should normally not exceed five weeks according to the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education guidelines]

Termination of the agreement

This Collaboration Agreement may be terminated on the following grounds:

- End of the stipulated period of validity.
- · Mutual agreement between the parties.
- Written notice of termination with 6 months in advance, provided the termination shall not become effective until the end of the stay of the students enrolled in both institutions on the date of notification.
